Students in grades fifth and sixth will take the math and ELA sessions of the test on Chromebooks. While the science and social studies tests will be paper and pencil.

Third through fourth grade students will take a paper and pencil test.

\*Beginning the week of March 13, 2017 kindergarten through sixth grade students will take the final iReady benchmarking assessment. Students who show growth in math and/or reading will be rewarded. We are planning an even larger incentive for those students who meet or exceed the goal that was set for them at the beginning of the year.
